December Safety Tips from the River Grove Fire Department:

A Fire-Safe Holiday: People gathering together is the real joy of the holiday season. Take a few moments to protect your friends and family from an unexpected tragedy. Test the smoke alarms in your home to make sure they're working, and be certain everyone in your family knows and practices your home fire escape plan.

Candle Care: Candles are a traditional and beautiful part of the holiday season. They are also a direct source of fire in your home, so be cautious with them. Use non-flammable holders and position candles a safe distance from your Christmas tree and other holiday decorations. Children are always fascinated by candles and are drawn to them, so place yours safely out of children's reach. Christmas Tree Safety: It's the holiday season and time to find just the right Christmas tree. Look for one that's fresh and green. The needles should bend and not snap between your fingers. At home, find a cool spot for your tree, away from heater vents and the fireplace. A dry tree is a serious fire hazard, so water yours often. After the holidays, dispose of the tree safely at a recycling center or with your pick-up service.

Plan ahead for cold weather:

- Plan ahead for the adversities of the winter season by taking a few simple preventative measures.
- Make certain your wood stove and heating system are always properly maintained and ready for extended use.
- For maintenance of your heating system contact your service person.
- Protect your water pipes from freezing by planning ahead.
- Turn off all outside faucets (preferably from an inside shut-off to each faucet).
- If no inside shut-off is provided, wrap the pipe with approved (**UL**) heating tape. You may also turn on any inside faucet, letting water drip slightly, allowing for expansion.
- Make certain that all vents from the crawl space under the house are closed or sealed to keep out cold air.
- **Note:** Should pipes become frozen do not use torches or other flame-producing equipment. A hair dryer often will thaw pipes, as will the application of warm water. Pay particular attention to the north and east sides of the house as they are vulnerable to freezing due to prevailing winds. In the event a broken pipe occurs, plan ahead by locating the main shut-off to the house and be prepared with a proper-fitting wrench.




Shout Out... Retiring Fire Chief Larry LaRiviere

After almost 20 years of service as the River Grove Fire Chief, Larry LaRiviere announced his retirement effective December 27, 2019. A second generation firefighter, Larry was first appointed as the River Grove fire chief in July 2000, bringing 30 years of emergency response experience to his new position. Chief Larry started his career in 1969 with the Franklin Park Fire Department where he attained both advanced firefighter and paramedic State certifications.

Seven years later he took the job as paramedic coordinator for the Village of Lincolnwood and eventually attained the rank of Battalion Chief in that town.

Chief Larry implemented a referendum providing around-the-clock paramedic and fire protection for the Village of River Grove. He restructured the rank of officers and department chain of command and is credited with the hiring of 50 new members and the remodeling of the station to accommodate additional personal. He won several FEMA grant awards, upgraded department policies and procedures, expanded mutual aid agreements with neighboring municipalities, restructured and improved ambulance billing procedures and restructured the 2% fund to comply to state statutes. It was under Chief LaRiviere's command that the residential smoke detector program began, he was the one who began the Santa Stop food drive. He also conducted a "Boot Day" and other fund raisers for Illinois Burn Camp. He instituted the flu shot program, the senior blood pressure screening programs, vife of life program, the pet sticker program and the In-home oxygen alert stickers. The Chief can also be credited as being instrumental in the acquisition of new needed vehicles, air packs and protective firefighting gear. The village will miss Chief Larry's experience and expertise in running the fire department operations and wish him the best of luck in his retirement and thank him for his dedicated service to the village.



River Grove Lions Park
