From the River Grove Public Safety Team

By far, the most common cause for delay in emergency response is the lack of proper address markings.

This is a serious problem that can be easily corrected. Here are some suggestions to help your fire, police and public works departments serve you better.

- If your home is visible from the street, place large numerals on the house in a position that is easily recognized. Use numerals as opposed to script. Script is often difficult to read quickly.
- If your home is set back, place your address numerals on a sign close to the street. Be sure that it can be easily read from any direction.
- If your residence has an alley, be sure to post address numerals in the back of your home as well as the front.
- If you place an emergency call from a neighbor's house, give the address where the emergency is, not where you are calling from.
- If possible, have someone meet us at the door or end of the driveway to guide us to the emergency.

Remember, anything you can do to help us find you, is a good thing!





Hello River Grove Resident's,

Our 2019 50/50 tree planting was a success this year. 29 residents got involved and we planted 32 trees this year on our village parkways. The trees included 1 Crab, 3 Redbuds, 2 Pears, 11 Autumn Blazes, 4 Lilacs, 1 Frontier Elm, 3 Accolade Elms, 2 Red Mables, 1 Sweet Gum, 2 Lindens, 1 Weeping Willow and a White Oak that was purchased by the River Grove Police Department in memory of 26 year retired River Grove Police Lieutenant Steve Oelkers.

Our 2019 50/50 Sidewalk replacement program was renamed the sidewalk liability replacement. It's been 10 years since we had this program in place and I thought that we should replace the damaged trip spots in town before the hairline cracks. There are many more trip spots in town, please be patient as we plan to get to them all as we keep this program a part of the budget.
