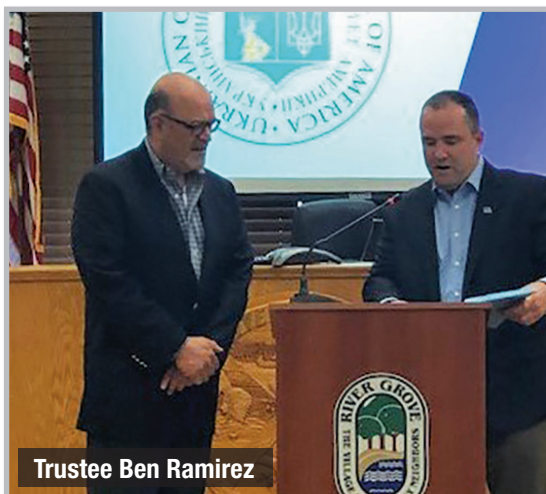

RGFD Gets A New Ambulance

River Grove has a new ambulance. Our residents can rest assured that if they ever need an ambulance, here in River Grove, it will be equipped with state of the art technology in prehospital care and conveyance. The new ambulance is equipped with a new Stryker powered ambulance cot that will help prevent employee back injuries and allow them to lift patients up to 700 lbs. Additionally, there is a **LIFEPAK 15 Defibrillator (including heart rate monitoring and 12-Lead EKG acquisition and interpretation)** that alerts the users to sudden changes. These allow the RGFD to provide leading-edge patient care.



Grand Avenue Construction!

The Illinois Department of Transportation will soon begin the project of repaving Grand Avenue. IDOT has bumped the project up on their schedule and have bid the repaving of Grand Avenue between Harlem Avenue and Elm Street. K-Five Construction is the contractor that will be completing the work. **The tentative start date was June 24, 2022. The project is slated to take about three to four months to complete.** While this construction will undoubtedly cause some traffic issues when traveling on either side of the river, there is no question that the work is needed. Village Engineer Mark Lucas commented, *"We all look forward to better than expected progress leading to an earlier completion date."* However, during the construction let us all exercise patience and appreciate that the temporary inconvenience will lead to a greatly improved Grand Avenue.

Capture and Reuse Stormwater

Rain barrels capture rainwater from your roof and save it for when you need it. By keeping this water out of the sewer system, they can also help reduce sewer overflows and flooding.

You can use rain barrel water to wash your car, water your lawn, or clean work boots and tools. Rain barrel water is naturally free of chlorine, lime, and calcium and some gardeners swear their plants prefer it. However, since rain barrel water is runoff from your roof, do not drink it!

Most homes can benefit from rain barrels. If you have areas of unpaved, pervious ground near your downspouts, rain barrels should work in your yard. Homeowners throughout Cook County have incorporated rain barrels into their yards with great results.
