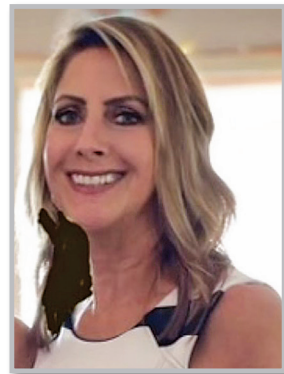
From the River Grove Police Department

The River Grove Police Department has collaborated with Kia and Hyundai motors to provide River Grove residents with free steering wheel locks. The RGPD has 100 of these locks to distribute to people who own a Kia or a Hyundai. They ask that residents bring proof of residency and vehicle registration to the police station. Parkway Do's and Don'ts from Brock Leder, Director of Public Works

The parkway is the area of grass between the curb line and the public sidewalk. Though this area is Village property, homeowners and businessowners are required to maintain it by mowing the grass and keeping the area free from weeds and debris. Trees can be planted on the parkway, but only by the Public Works Department or the Village's outside contractor. Only single stem trees are allowed on parkways; bushes and evergreen trees, along with certain species such as Willow trees are not permitted. Additionally, brick retaining walls or decorative stones are not allowed on parkways. Trees are to be ringed by mulched areas only. Tree maintenance is performed by the Public Works Department, seasonally, on street maintenance days, or when needed in case of emergency. The Public Works Department is trained in the proper care of trees and has the tools and vehicles necessary to complete the task safely. Please do not attempt to trim parkway trees yourself. If you have a parkway tree that has been planted in recent years, you should begin watering your tree as soon as the freezing weather breaks. Trees should be watered at a slow trickle over the course of an hour, a few times a week. In hot weather, even established trees may require some water. The Village will place tree bags on young trees to aid in watering. If your tree has a green bag on the trunk, you may omit ground watering and just fill the tree bag a few times a week. Please refrain from hanging any type of decoration from your tree's lower limbs including chimes, bird feeders, or swings. Fire Pit Safety from RG Fire Chief Sean Flynn

- Keep children and pets at least 3 feet away from the fire
- Do not use any flammable liquid to start the fire
- Keep the fire at least 10 feet away from combustible items
- Extinguish with the drown-stir-drown method of dumping water on the fire
- If it is too hot to touch, it is too hot to leave
- Remember, if your clothes catch fire, stop, drop, and roll away from the fire while covering your face
- Be a good neighbor and keep smoke from entering your neighbor's house. Smoke can aggravate people's health issues
