Reminders from Fire Chief Sean Flynn: 2023 Fireworks Safety Tips

- Please leave the fireworks to the professionals.
- At least nine people died, and an estimated 11,500 people were injured in fireworks-related accidents last year, according to U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission.
- Always use fireworks outside and have a bucket of water/hose nearby in case of accidents.
- Designate a safety perimeter; 35 feet away from structures and people is best.
- Ditch faulty fireworks; soak both spent and unused fireworks in water for a few hours before discarding them.
- Supervise children when they are handling sparklers. Sparklers burn at about 2,000 degrees Fahrenheit — hot enough to melt some metals.
- Don't forget about your pets! Keep your pets indoors, close the curtains, and turn on the TV or radio to create distractions.
- Never place a part of your body directly over a firework or hold a firework in your hand when lighting.
- Avoid alcohol consumption when handling or using fireworks.



New Bike Lockers at the River Grove Metra Station

New bike lockers were installed at the River Grove Metra Station. The previous bike lockers were falling apart and needed to be replaced. These new, state of the art, Alpen bike storage units are secure and will hold the bike, the rider's belongings and other essentials. Public Works Director Brock Leder said, *"The new lockers are a safe and efficient way to lock up a commuter's bike and allow them to be confident that they are returning to a secured dry bike when they get off the train."* Please contact the Village Hall for pricing and availability.
