River Grove National Night Out

National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie to make our neighborhoods safer, more caring places to live. It enhances the relationship between neighbors and law enforcement while bringing back a true sense of community and provides a great opportunity to bring police and neighbors together under positive circumstances. River Grove celebrated National Night Out at River Front Park with the RGPD providing free hot dogs, chips and water to residents. They also had inflatables, a face painter and many games for the kids in town to play. There was a deejay on hand to add to the atmosphere as well as a CPD fly over helicopter and a Sheriff's department German Shepard. Chief Mike Konwinski said, *"National Night Out is in its 39th year. It was celebrated by over 17,000 communities nationwide, and attended by over 38 million neighbors. In Illinois, the River Grove Police Department is one of 200 law enforcement agencies that formally participated in National Night Out."*

Many different tree varieties will be offered.
